#### Senior Shirt 2026 - Pre-order Senior Shirt

Every year the Year 6 students wear their senior shirt with pride as they complete their final year of primary school. As the year 5 students approach the end of their school year and prepare to enter year 6, they all have had an opportunity to be involved in designing what their senior shirt will look like. The shirt is currently in the development stage and a sample will be available for us to view soon. In the meantime, I have included some examples below of senior shirts from the last couple of years so you have an idea of what it may look like.

The challenge we have, is because they are uniquely designed for that year (not a stocked item in the uniform shop) we do need to get the ordering underway promptly to have everything in place so we can have the shirts out to us by the start of term 1.

The 1st round of pre-ordering has now been finalised. We understand that everyone couldn't meet the 1st round deadline, so we are preparing to place another order when we have enough. This just means you may need to wait a bit longer to receive your order (approximately the start of term 2).

This time of year and the New Year is the busiest time for the uniform shop so to effectively manage the senior shirt orders through the shop, Online Ordering is the preferred option. We do also realise the challenges with online platforms and not everyone may have access. If this is the case, please contact the uniform shop or pop in on trading days and we can provide you with a manual form and pay cash/card or EFT.



# **Supporting Numeracy Skills at Home**

At Forest Lake State School, numeracy is about more than numbers, it's about helping our students make sense of the world through reasoning, problem-solving, and recognising patterns in everyday life. We aim to nurture positive attitudes towards numeracy across all learning areas, encouraging curiosity, confidence and critical thinking.

Here are three simple ways to build numeracy into your home routines (and have fun doing it):

Cooking and recipes: Involve your child in reading and adjusting recipes. Ask questions such as, "If we double this recipe, how many cups will we need?" or "If one tray fits six muffins, how many do we need for twelve?" Cooking offers meaningful opportunities to explore measurement, fractions and estimation.

Everyday decisions: When shopping, travelling, or planning an outing, invite your child to think mathematically. Try prompts like, "Which option gives better value?", "If we leave at 3:45 pm and the movie starts at 4:30 pm, how much time do we have?", or "How many ten minute blocks make up that drive?"

Games and challenges: Encourage numeracy through play with card and dice games, building with blocks, measuring distances in backyard sports or solving puzzles together. These activities help develop strategic thinking, spatial awareness and problem-solving skills.

By weaving numeracy into everyday conversations and activities, you're helping your child see that mathematics, and numeracy more broadly, is not just something learned at school, it's part of how we understand and navigate the world.







## **Academic Assembly**

This year our Academic Awards Assembly will be on Monday, 8th December at 9.15am. Students in Years 4 & 5 who receive an A in both Semester 1 and Semester 2 for English, Mathematics and/or Science will receive an award/s. Year 6 students receiving an Academic Award will be announced and presented at the Year 6 Graduation. In addition to this, our 2026 School leaders will be announced. Prior to the event, parents of students involved will receive an email closer to the date. We look forward to celebrating 2025 student achievement!



### **BYOD (iPad) Information Session**

## The Reading Room in the Library

Start your morning with a story! The Reading Room is open in the library every Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday from 8:15 to 8:30am, and families are warmly invited to join in. It's a lovely way to begin the day by sharing books, building connections, and enjoying the calm buzz of reading before school starts.

Each Wednesday, a special guest reader takes the spotlight! Teachers volunteer to read aloud with students, choosing favourite stories or new adventures to share. It's always a surprise who might pop up next and what story they'll bring to life!

Students can keep track of their visits by signing their Reading Room card each time they attend. After a set number of visits, they'll earn a small prize to celebrate their reading effort. We love welcoming readers and their families into the library and encourage everyone to make reading together a daily habit because a few pages shared each day can make a world of difference.
