Senior Shirt 2026 - Pre-order Senior Shirt

Every year the Year 6 students wear their senior shirt with pride as they complete their final year of primary school. As the year 5 students approach the end of their school year and prepare to enter year 6, they all have had an opportunity to be involved in designing what their senior shirt will look like. The shirt is currently in the development stage and a sample will be available for us to view soon. In the meantime, I have included some examples below of senior shirts from the last couple of years so you have an idea of what it may look like.

The challenge we have, is because they are uniquely designed for that year (not a stocked item in the uniform shop) we do need to get the ordering underway promptly to have everything in place so we can have the shirts out to us by the start of term 1.

The 1st round of pre-ordering has now been finalised. We understand that everyone couldn't meet the 1st round deadline, so we are preparing to place another order when we have enough. This just means you may need to wait a bit longer to receive your order (approximately the start of term 2).

This time of year and the New Year is the busiest time for the uniform shop so to effectively manage the senior shirt orders through the shop, Online Ordering is the preferred option. We do also realise the challenges with online platforms and not everyone may have access. If this is the case, please contact the uniform shop or pop in on trading days and we can provide you with a manual form and pay cash/card or EFT.



Transitions for 2026

As we move further into Term 4, our transition program for 2026 is well underway. While we are already supporting our incoming Prep students and preparing our Year 6s for their move to high school, it is now time to focus on transitions for all current Prep-Year 5 students as they prepare for their next year level.

Over the coming weeks, teachers will be speaking with students about what 2026 may look like for them. These conversations help children understand that changes to class groupings, staff, buildings and routines are a normal and positive part of school life. We encourage all families to continue these discussions at home, focusing on building

confidence and excitement for the year ahead.

In **Week 7**, our Inclusion Team will begin gentle "walk-throughs" with students who may benefit from extra time to process upcoming changes. These walks may include visits to morning waiting areas, playgrounds, toilet blocks and cohort spaces. If you see students touring the school with an Inclusion Teacher, please know this is part of our transition support designed to help them feel secure and prepared.

During **Weeks 8 and 9**, students requiring additional transition support will have opportunities to spend short, supported sessions in the block they will move into next year. With the help of their current Inclusion Teacher or Aide, they may complete a worksheet, puzzle or game in the wet areas or middle rooms of their future year level. These sessions also allow them to meet the Inclusion staff who will be supporting that block in 2026.

In **Week 10**, a small number of students will participate in more intensive transition visits. At times, teachers may welcome one of their 2026 students for part of a lesson or activity to help strengthen familiarity and comfort.

We are proud of all FLSS entrants and thank you to Ms Dionysius for her encouragement and support.




Semester Two Report Cards
